Nature Trail System

Over 2.5 miles of trails have been constructed at Taylorsville Lake. These trails were constructed by the Boy Scouts of America and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. We hope you enjoy your walk along these trails and ask that you help keep the trails clean and report any trail obstructions or hazards to the Corps Office/Visitor Center, which is located near the Trailhead.

Hikers are cautioned to be constantly alert of possible trail hazards such as poison oak/ivy, hanging limbs, slippery paths and/or trail obstructions such as fallen trees or limbs.

Because there are some steep slopes and rocky surfaces along the trail, sturdy shoes or hiking boots are recommended.

The level of difficulty of these trails are:


Hilltop Loop Trail	Light
Ridgetop Trail	Light
Lakeview Trail	Moderate to Heavy

Each trail has also been color-coded to assist you during your hike. Trees are marked at least every 25 feet with the color indicated below:

Hilltop Loop Trail	Yellow
Ridgetop Trail	Blue
Lakeview Trail	White
