Remediation Work

Removal action at SOP-Z was suspended in order to get approval to address additional volumes of soil that required UXO screening, not originally covered under the current field effort. With the winter approaching and the need for additional expenditures field work ceased on November 17, 2012. SOP-Z was secured, with work now to resume in mid-April 2013.

The property owner, GP-8, Inc. of former River Valley School property conducted an annual inspection of the engineered cap at area OU-1 on November 5, 2012. All activity and use limitations remain in place and are being fully complied with.
