

Remember These Rules

1. OVERTAKING PASSING: Boat being passed has the right-of-way. KEEP CLEAR.
2. MEETING HEAD-ON: Keep to the right.
3. CROSSING: Boat on right has right-of-way. Slow down & permit it to pass.

Share the Water Safely

The leading causes of boating accidents are capsizing, falls overboard, and collisions. Be safe while boating! Keep your distance from other boats and fishermen.

Alcohol is believed to be a factor in more than 50% of boating accidents that result in death. Alcohol induces fatigue, affects coordination and balance. In combination with motion and engine noise of the boat, the effects of the sun, wind, and glare, alcohol can be deadly for anyone on the water.

Life jackets prevent serious injury or death, but will only work when worn properly.
