B. REQUIRED ADDITIONAL COMMENTS TO SUPPORT JD. EXPLAIN RATIONALE FOR DETERMINATION THAT THE REVIEW AREA ONLY INCLUDES DRY LAND: The ponds on site were constructed in the uplands. OW1 did not exhibit a jurisdictional channel above or below the pond within the site boundaries. OW2 did not exhibit a jurisdictional channel above or below the pond within the site boundaries. OW2 appears to have been created in abandoned farm land after 1968. The features were not constructed from nor do the ponds capture waters of the U.S. Therefore, the ponds are not waters of the U.S. and are not regulated under the Clean Water Act.
