- **B.** Typical year assessment(s): Typical year assessment was conducted utilizing desktop and the submitted preconstruction notification. Based on the aforementioned supporting documentation, the conditions as described in Part II: Findings under Section C Clean Water Act Section 404 and Section D Excluded Waters or Features were determined to be typical
- C. Additional comments to support AJD: A desktop review of the proposed project site indicated the two identified wetlands sat high in the landscape as compared to the intermittent tributary. Photographs submitted by the applicant's agent provided a visual reference as to the depth of the tributary. FEME national flood hazard mapping showed the proposed project area in an area of minimal flood potential and a review of available topographic maps indicate a slightly sloping landscape. The only downstream connection to jurisdictional waters is via ephemeral tributaries that convey hydrology during precipitation events and area surface runoff. Given the above-mentioned factors and the Navigable Water Protection Rule (b)(3) jurisdictional exclusion of ephemeral tributaries, inundation of the identified wetlands would be unlikely and therefore considered non-jurisdictional.
