The JW Hawkins drain is a railroad ditch that runs south along the east side of the Monon Trail, which is located on the former Monon Railway. The railway was originally built in 1847, and abandoned in the 1980's, and later developed into the Monon Trail. The ditch begins at the northern end as a 4-ft RCP. The ditch appears to have been excavated in uplands when the railroad was originally constructed, likely to obtain fill and to convey stormwater runoff along the railroad and surrounding area. As far back as available historic aerials and maps reach (1941), the railroad and ditch appear to be present in the location they are today. The surrounding land in 1941 and later years appears to be entirely upland agricultural ground, until the City of Carmel begins to be developed through the years. There is no available evidence to suggest that the ditch was a naturally occurring stream, or that it altered or relocated a tributary, or that it was constructed in
