#### LOUISVILLE DISTRICT OVERVIEW

- Established in 1886, the Louisville District employs approximately 1,250 people in the five-state area of Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan and Ohio out of 43 field offices. The district has military, environmental and civil works missions.
- Geographic Area:
  - Civil works: 67,000 sq. miles in Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Ohio, small area in Tennessee
  - ➤ Military: 306,000 sq. miles in Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Ohio



# **ARMY RESERVE – NATIONAL PROGRAM MANAGER**




Note: Geographic splits shown on the map represent the four Army Reserve Readiness Divisions.





# AIR FORCE RESERVE - NATIONAL PROGRAM MANAGER








# **CIVIL WORKS PROGRAM**





### PROGRAMS HISTORY & OUTLOOK



- This illustrates the history and outlook of the District's three mission areas: Civil Works, Military Construction, and International & Interagency Support (IIS).
- The high point in FY11 for MILCON was due to the BRAC funding, which tapered off through FY14, reaching a steady state in FY15-18. The outlook for Military Construction funding is projected to remain steady fluctuating between the 400 and 600 million per year mark.
- The IIS program has had various small projects through the years, but FY16 was the year that put the program on the map for us when we became the design/construction agent for the Louisville Veterans affairs Medical Center (VAMC), and the Canandaigua VAMC, and the Fort Knox VA Community Based Outpatient Clinic.
- While the IIS program will continue to grow and add most substance to our overall program, we do anticipate a slight decline in our Civil Works program, in large part due to the construction completion of the Olmsted Lock and Dam project.
