Biography

Colonel Robert A. Rowlette, Jr. was commissioned in the Corps of Engineers upon graduation from the University of Kentucky in 1979 where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering. He also earned his Master of Science degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Kentucky in 1990 and is registered as a Professional Engineer in the Commonwealths of Virginia and Kentucky. He is a graduate of the Army Command and General Staff College. His military honors include the Meritorious Service Medal with seven Oak Leaf Clusters, Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster, and the National Defense Service Medal.

His prior assignments include tours in the continental United States and Hawaii. He has previously served as a project manager and assistant chief Army Programs in the Louisville District. Following his assignment to Louisville District he served with the 46th Engineer Battalion at Ft. Rucker, AL as a company commander and operations officer. His next assignment was an instructor and Assistant Professor of Mathematical Sciences at the United States Military Academy at West Point, NY. Following graduation from the Command and General Staff College, he served as the Executive Officer for the 84th Engineer Battalion at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii. He next served as the Operations Officer for the 416th ENCOM FWD Cell at Ft. McPherson, GA. He then commanded the Charleston District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in Charleston, SC. Most recently he served as the Engineer Colonel Assignments Officer with the U.S. Total Army Personnel Command before attending the Canadian Forces College in Toronto, Ontario.
