This notice announces an application submitted for a Department of the Army (DA) Permit, subject to Section 404 of the Clean Water Act:

Buffalo Run and Buffalo Run, on an approximately 98-acre site, located south of the intersection of KY Highway 480 and Interstate 65 (I-65) in

Bullitt County, Kentucky.

PURPOSE: To provide light industrial/warehouse development

and associated infrastructure along the I-65 and

KY Highway 480 corridor in Bullitt County,

Kentucky.

DESCRIPTION OF WORK: The applicant is requesting an after-the-fact permit to retain fill material that was placed in 1.11 acres of emergent wetlands. The applicant is also proposing to place clean fill material obtained from onsite and offsite into an additional 5.27 acres of emergent wetlands, 35 linear feet (0.001 acre) of an unnamed ephemeral tributary to Buffalo Run and 60 linear feet (0.01 acre) of an unnamed intermittent tributary to Buffalo run to facilitate the construction of a light industrial/warehouse development with associated roads, parking and infrastructure.

AVOIDANCE, MINIMIZATION, AND MITIGATION MEASURES: The applicant indicates there is no alternative to avoid the placement of fill material into "waters of the United States (U.S.)." The applicant

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proposes that approximately 6.73 acres of compensatory mitigation would be provided through the establishment of emergent wetlands located on a site approximately 1.5 miles south of the proposed development within the same watershed of Buffalo Run. Mitigation activities would include excavation/grading, filling the existing pond to create a shallow wetland and grading the upland areas to create the appropriate slope, invasive species treatment and native wetland plant establishment. The proposed off-site mitigation would be monitored for a minimum of five years and would be protected through a conservation easement.

In addition to the proposed off-site mitigation, the applicant proposes to purchase 6.0 Adjusted Mitigation Units (AMUs) of wetland credit and 60 AMUs of stream credit from an approved mitigation bank or from the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources (KDFWR) Stream and Wetland Restoration In-Lieu Fee Program to mitigate for the remaining wetland and intermittent stream impacts. The applicant proposes to mitigate for impacts to the ephemeral stream through the installation of an onsite stormwater management system.

It is noted that this proposed mitigation plan is open to comment and subject to change. The Corps will make a determination of appropriate mitigation, upon review of all submitted information.

REVIEW PROCEDURES: A DA Permit cannot be issued if any legally required Federal, State, or local authorization or certification is denied. A DA permit, if otherwise warranted, will not be issued until a State of Kentucky Water Quality Certification or waiver is on file at this office. In order to comply with Section 401 of the Clean Water Act, the applicant must apply for State certification from the Kentucky Energy and Environment Cabinet Division of Water (KDOW).

Copies of this notice are sent to the appropriate Federal and State Fish and Wildlife Agencies. Their views and comments are solicited in accordance with the Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act of 1956. Based on available information, the proposed activity will not destroy or endanger any Federally-listed threatened or endangered species or their critical habitats, as identified under the Endangered Species Act, and therefore, initiation of formal consultation procedures with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is not planned at this time.

Any person may request, in writing, within the comment period specified in this notice, that a public hearing be held to consider this application. A request for a public hearing must state the specific interest which might be damaged by issuance of the DA Permit.

The National Register of Historic Places has been examined, and it has been determined that there are no properties currently listed on the Register which would be directly affected by the proposed work. If we

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are made aware, as a result of comments received in response to this notice, or by other means, of specific archaeological, scientific, prehistorical, or historical sites or structures which might be affected by the proposed work, the District Engineer will immediately take the appropriate action necessary pursuant to the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 - Public Law 89-665 as amended (including Public Law 96-515).

The decision whether to issue a permit will be based on an evaluation of the probable impact of the proposed activity on the public interest. That decision will reflect the national concern for both protection and utilization of important resources. The benefits which reasonably may be expected to accrue from the proposal must be balanced against its reasonably foreseeable detriments. All factors which may be relevant to the proposal will be considered; among those are conservation, economics, aesthetic values, general environmental concerns, historic values, fish and wildlife values, flood damage prevention, land use, navigation, recreation, water supply, water quality, energy needs, safety, food production, and in general, the needs and welfare of the public. In addition, the evaluation of the impact of the activity on the public interest will include application of the quidelines (40 CFR Part 230) promulgated by the Administrator, United States Environmental Protection Agency, under authority of Section 404(b) of the CWA.

The Corps of Engineers is soliciting comments from the public; Federal, State, and local agencies and officials; Indian tribes; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of this proposed activity. It is presumed that all interested parties and agencies will wish to respond; therefore, a lack of response will be interpreted as meaning that there is no objection to the proposed project. Any comments received will be considered by the Corps of Engineers to determine whether to issue, modify, condition or deny a permit for this proposal. To make this decision, comments are used to assess impacts on endangered species, historic properties, water quality, general environmental effects, and the other public interest factors listed above. Comments are used in the preparation of an Environmental Assessment and/or an Environmental Impact Statement pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act. Comments are also used to determine the need for a public hearing and to determine the overall public interest of the proposed activity.

Written statements received in this office on or before the closing date will become a part of the official record and will be considered in the determination on this permit request. Any objections which are received during this period will be forwarded to the applicant for possible resolution before the determination is made whether to issue or deny the requested DA Permit. A permit will be granted unless its issuance is found to be contrary to the public interest.


