Civil: 76,000 sq. miles in Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Ohio, small area in Tennessee
Military: 306,000 sq. miles in Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Ohio

Workload: On average, the district awards approximately \$1 billion in civil works and military contracts. Small business contracts are 35 percent of this total.
